

2010 EarthWays Center Public Tour Weekend Themes

Learn about low-cost, sustainable living options by taking a guided tour of the EarthWays Center – a Victorian home restored as a model of energy and resource efficiency. From repainting a room to rehabbing or building a new house – ideas abound! Tours are offered on the third full weekend of every month at 11 a.m., noon, 1 p.m. and 2 p.m. Each month's tours will focus on a different theme with particular attention given to that topic in addition to the general tour. No reservations are needed; however, groups of adults or youth require advance booking. Fee \$3/person and free for Garden members.

February 20 & 21, 2010

EarthWays Open House Public Tour Weekend: “Here Comes the Sun.”

Experts will be on hand to describe & demonstrate how solar energy works, and kids can take unique pictures using a film process known as cyanography. Visitors will be invited to discover small-scale renewable energy options for their home including current and future technology, local resources, and more.
