Green Drinks began in 1989 in England and now is happening monthly in more than 239 cities on seven continents around the world. It’s an independent, self-organizing network and an opportunity for those interested in sustainability and environmental issues to gather, network, learn what others are doing, and to discuss issues important to them. Each month, people who work in or are simply interested in the green movement meet for drinks at casual sessions. The goal of Green Drinks is to promote understanding between and inspire action in many sectors of society, from the corporate level to the homeowner.

The St. Louis chapter was founded two years ago. St. Louis Green Drinks prides itself on being an informal networking event for people interested in local sustainability. It’s a low-key, un-academic way to find out what’s happening in St. Louis and to connect with like-minded people. Catch up with people you know and make new contacts; everyone invites someone else along, so there’s always a different crowd, making Green Drinks an organic, flexible network.

The events are very simple and unstructured, but many people have found employment, made friends, developed new ideas, done deals and had moments of inspiration. As of late, the St. Louis events have been arranged so that every month has a different theme and alternate Tuesdays and Wednesdays. The odd months are organized with a brief panelist template, and usually a few individuals (often representing expert organizations relating to the month’s theme) are introduced to describe their work and latest achievements & issues. For example, the July event, titled “Greening Your Organization,” featured local heroes who briefly described efforts happening to green

both corporate business structures and small, independent companies. The even months feel more like a party, and serve to highlight featured green locations.
